academic staff union had embarked on a one week warning strike.

While addressing the management and staff unions of Yaba College of Technology, the Executive Secretary said “as grand mother of all polytechnics in the country, Yaba College of Technology should not allow any little misunderstanding within to get out of the College”.

But in a swift response, the Registrar of the College observed that there was no acrimony between the Management and the unions. This was further corroborated by the College chapter Chairman of ASUP, who stated that the union has reached a truce with the management and the issue in question has been resolved amicably.

Also speaking, the Rector of the College, Dr. Mrs. Kudirat Ladipo commended the Honourable Minister and the Management of NBTE for the passion they have for the college. She stated that the unions have been very supportive of her administration but noted that they always disagree to agree. She said the issue bothered on non-payment of peculiar allowances and welfare package due to the problem of insufficient funds.

The Rector who commended the Treasury Single Account (TSA) policy of the Federal Government said she is operating a very open and transparent administration, explaining that she used over a billion naira last year to settle the backlog of liabilities and staff entitlements.

Speaking further, the Executive Secretary lamented that government was really confronted with the challenge of funding all projects but urged polytechnics to

key into government's policies that require manpower development including the railway sector.

He said the Honourable Minister was honest and willing to ensure that education sector gets what it deserves and appealed to the unions to try as much as possible to deemphasize strike, noting that “because of strikes most parents now send their children to educational institutions abroad which may not be better than Nigerian institutions”.

The Executive Secretary tasked lecturers to take up the challenge of sharpening the skills of artisans and technicians, pointing that he wished

Nigeria will be in a position to provide manpower to other African countries and beyond.

While urging the rector to be more open in all her dealings, he further encouraged the staff to work together with management to achieve the objectives for which the institution was established, stressing that “I see a situation where Yaba College of Technology will grow into an institution similar to Massachusetts institute of Technology”.

The Executive Secretary who also held a reconciliatory meeting with the Management and Staff Unions

ES Tasks WITED on Women Participation in TVET

The Executive Secretary of National Board for Technical Education (NBTE), Dr. M. A Kazaure has stated that the association of Women in Technical Education (WITED) has a pivotal role to play in encouraging more women participation in Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET).

Dr. Kazaure who stated this in an address he delivered at the formal inauguration of the NBTE chapter of Women in Technical Education in Kaduna, noted that only 34% of women enrolled in TVET institutions as against 64% of the men in the 2011/12 – 2014/15 academic sessions.

He called for concerted efforts to encourage more women participation in TVET, create more opportunities for the women and keep them abreast of technological developments as well as make them more relevant in the labour market.

The Executive Secretary who was represented at occasion by the Director of Academic Planning Research, Statistics and ICT, Engr. Danjuma Jibrin Usman explained that the Commonwealth Association of Polytechnics in Africa (CAPA) embarked on the WITED project in 1988 in reaction to the exceedingly low participation of Women in Science and Technical Education in its member institutions.

He said the project has as its long-term objective to enhance participation of the girl-child and women in science and technical education at all levels; while other objectives seek to foster gender equality in line with the Sustainable Development Goals 4 in Science and Technology since these domains are top priorities to any meaningful national

development plan as well as identifying the factors which impede female participation in technical education, training and employment.

According to the Executive Secretary, the Council of Heads of Polytechnics and Colleges of Technology in Nigeria (COHEADS) is actively involved in the implementation of WITED

project which he said has local chapters in almost all Polytechnics in Nigeria.

Dr. Kazaure expressed the hope that a functional branch of WITED in NBTE will play a key role in achieving the objectives of the project noting that the Board's chapter will serve as a hub for all WITED chapters in the TVET

ES Urges Institutions to Stay Focused on their Mandates

Executive Secretary of the National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) Dr. M.A Kazaure has advised monotechnics in the country to remain focused on their core mandates in order to achieve the objectives for which the institutions were established.

He said most monotechnics are seeking to change their status to polytechnic to enable them access funding from the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund).

The Executive Secretary disclosed that since the TETFund intervention does not cover monotechnics and other specialized institutions, some Colleges of Agriculture, which are mostly state owned have transformed to polytechnics to enable them access the fund.

Dr. Kazaure who was reacting to a request for change of status by officials of the Maritime Academy of Nigeria, Oron, decried such trend which he described as harmful to the development of the sectors for which such institutions were established to promote.

He said for an institution to be

considered as a polytechnic, it must offer the three core engineering programmes which include Mechanical, Electrical Electronics and Civil Engineering. He added that it is the mandate of

the academy to produce manpower for the maritime sector that makes it a monotechnic.

The Executive Secretary urged the academy to remain focused on its mandate while exploring other avenues for funding, disclosing that the Board was making efforts to ensure that monotechnics are included in the TETFund intervention.

Earlier, the Ag. Rector of the Academy, Mr. Mkpandiok Ante M. said they were in

Kaduna to seek the Board's assistance on how to address the issue of 65 years retirement age as its affect personnel of the academy with IPPIS, confirmation of accreditation of programmes, mounting of HND programme in Electrical/Electronic as well as exploring ways of accessing funding from TETFund.

The Provost lamented that the issue of funding was seriously threatening the actualization of the mandate of the academy.

NSE Lauds Dr. Kazaure's Effort to Transform TVE Sector

The Kaduna Chapter of Nigerian Society of Engineers (NSE) has commended the Executive Secretary of National Board for Technical Education (NBTE), Dr. M.A. Kazaure for his effort to transform Nigeria's Technical and Vocational Education (TVE) sector.

The Chairman, Engr. Dr. R. Babalola who led a delegation of the Society to NBTE in Kaduna described Dr. Kazaure as “the right man at the right place” who will transform the technical and vocational education sector in Nigeria.

Engr. Babalola said the Society was on the visit to explore areas of collaboration with the Board particularly in development and review of engineering curriculum as well as participation of its members in accreditation of engineering programmes offered in the polytechnics.

He noted that the concern to review the existing curriculum stems out of the need to produce competent hands to enhance professionalism and standards, adding that “there is also the need to develop on the research of students which is common practice in some of the developed countries”.

The Society also expressed worry over the scrapping of automotive engineering curriculum by some polytechnics and appealed to the Board to stop the trend, arguing that that automotive engineering is still very useful in the automobile industry even with the introduction of new technologies in the system.

The Chairman said they were also in the Board to invite the Executive Secretary to the Society's 2017 Conference slated for the later part of the year.

Responding, the Executive Secretary thanked the delegation for the visit and gave the assurance that the Board would continue to collaborate with NSE and other similar bodies in the country to ensure that some of the outdated curricular offered in the TVET institutions are reviewed.

He expressed the need for the upgrading and replacement of equipment in the Technical and Vocational Education institutions in line with the review of outdated and obsolete curriculum, while also lamenting that government gives so much preference to university education than the technical education sector which makes the bulk of contribution to the national economy.

Reacting on the challenge of utilizing research and innovations produced by the institutions, the Executive Secretary said this has continued to be a problem, stressing that even when public exhibitions are held everything ends up with the public show but gave the assurance that the problem will be addressed through

the national Vocational Qualification Framework (NVQF), which he said the Board is seriously putting in place.

The Executive Secretary welcomed the society's collaboration with the Board and pledged to support the proposed conference, stating that the Board also has MOU with COREN and has been involving members of the Council in its accreditation exercise.

Reacting on the issue of scrapping automotive engineering curriculum by some polytechnics, the Ag. Director, Polytechnic Programmes Department, Mal. Musa Isgogo said that the decision was made by COREN not really to scrap the curriculum but to modify it to include mechatronics.

Board Conducts 2017 Senior Staff Promotion Exercise

The Management Committee of the National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) has conducted the year 2017 Senior Staff Promotion exercise.

The exercise which commenced in December 2016 with the collation of completed Annual Performance Evaluation Report (APER) forms continued in January 2017 with the confirmation/display of approved list of candidates for the examination and consideration of questions/markings schemes by the management committee.

The promotion examination was held on 6th February, 2017, while the oral interview was conducted on Monday, 20th February, 2017.

No fewer than 73 officers participated in the exercise which had only one officer shortlisted for the position of Deputy Director, while eleven officers were shortlisted for promotion to the rank of Chief Officer.

While soliciting the NBTE's support towards the actualization of the objectives of the association, the president explained that X-ray Technicians and Technologists Board when established would be responsible for regularizing the qualifying examinations as well as be an awarding body for certification and licensing of practitioners.

He also called on the NBTE to include members of the association in accreditation exercise of the Board particularly in the area of medical x-ray training.

Responding, the Executive Secretary, Dr. Masa'udu Adamu Kazaure thanked the association

While expressing concern over the lack of proper coordination of associations especially within the health sector, Dr. Kazaure however stated that the government prefers

to deal with associations rather than dealing with individuals.

He urged them to always keep the objectives of the association above individual interest while also encouraging them to continue with the good work, stressing that the medical sector cannot compromise quality and substance.

PSN Wants Harmonization of Pharmacy Technicians Curriculum

The Pharmaceutical Society of Nigeria (PSN) has expressed the need to harmonize the training of pharmacy technicians in the country by setting up a committee to harmonize the pharmacy technicians training curriculum.

The President of the Society, Ahmed I. Yakasai who stated this while on a visit to the NBTE Executive Secretary in Kaduna said, the action has become necessary in view of the need for all stakeholders to work together to serve the needs of the people.

The President also called for a change of the nomenclature “Pharmacy Technology”, explaining that “Pharmacy Technology” refers to the title of Pharmacy programme at the postgraduate level.

Also speaking, the Registrar of Pharmacists Council of Nigeria (PCN) Pharm Elijah Mohammed said the National Universities Commission (NUC) adopted the Pharmacy Technician as entry point for the direct entry candidates for pharmacy programme in the university.

The Registrar stated that the Council was also interacting with stakeholders in the training of Pharmacy Technicians to review pharmacy technicians training curriculum so as to boost its content in line with global best practices to enhance their practice and eligibility for admission into Nigerian Universities.

He said the Council prescribes the curriculum for training, indexes the students, supervises and approves the final examinations in addition to determining the human resources requirements and other components required for teaching and learning.

Responding, the NBTE Executive Secretary, Dr. M.A. Kazaure urged the agencies to find a way of

of the Federal Polytechnic, Nasarawa urged the parties to put the interest of the institution over and above any personal interest. Dr. Kazaure admonished them to note that their employment in the institution was for the sake of the students and nothing else.

The staff unions who had embarked on a one week warning strike presented a 26-point demand bothering on inadequate funding, lack of basic infrastructure including library resources, non-payment of certain allowances and other staff claims.

But reacting to the staff demands, Rector of the Polytechnic, Prof. Abdulkadir Shetima Saidu while assuring that the management was ready for peace, said the polytechnic impacts on the Nasarawa community economically, socially and employment-wise, insisting that they want peace and harmony in the institution.

He however stated that the unions' demands were meant to create disharmony in the institution, explaining that it was not a secret
